Libang launches 5G healthcare use cases at Pasighat

ITANAGAR, Jun 22: Arunachal Pradesh Health & Family Welfare Minister Alo Libang, along with North Eastern Council (NEC) Secretary K Moses Chalai, on Thursday inaugurated the NEC-funded "5G Application in NER with Hub at AMTRON, Guwahati" project in a function at College of Agriculture (CoA), Central Agricultural University, Pasighat in East Siang district.

Libang also visited BPGH, where the project is being implemented, to get acquainted with practical deployment of 5G health AI solutions in the hospital OPD and its benefits to the patients and the healthcare professionals.

At CoA, he visited the 5G lab and was apprised by the Dean Dr AK Tripathi and others of the 5G use case applications of IoT & technology in agriculture sector and its benefits to the farmers in smart farming, ranging from irrigation, livestock monitoring, precision farming, agricultural drones, etc.
